These archives provide much information concerning French legislation and the way it has been enforced.
She can also help students who want to collect data by interviews of high-ranking civil servants in positions of authority during from 1970 to 2000 in France.
J. Simon can help researchers who wish to use of the Archives of the Faculté de Pharmacie in Paris, and can also introduce them to local archives in Lyon and in Grenoble.

This program will serve to help S. Chauveau develop trans national comparisons concerning healthcare. She is now starting a new research project on Alzheimer and Parkinson disease as models of 'medicalization' of elderly people, and this will include the development of pharmaceuticals in the treatment of these diseases.
